The New EKG Machine and Recent Foundation Achievements:

The new EKG machine will enhance Boundary Community Clinics' ability to diagnose and treat heart-related conditions. In addition to this remarkable achievement, the Fry Healthcare Foundation has recently funded the purchase of new defibrillators for the Emergency Department, a CO2 incubator for the Laboratory, chairs for patient rooms, an echocardiogram transducer, new overbed patient tables, high seating chairs, a new ice machine, a pediatric examination table, and a barcode scanner.
